

Layover Mitts

Materials: 1 skein Mrs. Crosby Carpet Bag
80% superwash Merino 20% silk
240 yards/100 grams
Size 6 US straight (or circular) needles
Size 6 US double point needles
10 small gorgeous buttons
needle and thread
1 stitch marker

Gauge: 5 stitches = 1 inch in stockinette



Picot cast on 39 sts as follows

1. Cast on 5 stitches using a knitted cast on.
 2. Bind off 2 stitches.
 3. Slip 1 stitch from right needle to left.
 4. Cast on 4 stitches
 5. Bind off 2 stitches
 6. Slip 1 stitch from right needle to left.
- Continue step 4-6 until you have 39 stitches.

Row 1: K2tog, K to end

Row 2: Purl

Row 3: Knit

Continue row 2 & 3 until piece measures 4 inches ending after a knit row.

Switch to double point needles, and join for working in the round, being careful not to twist the cast-on edge. Mark the beginning of round with stitch marker.

Round 1: Knit

Round 2: K1 *yo, k2, k2tog, k2* repeat until 1 stitch remains, K1.

Round 3: Knit

Round 4: K1 * k2, k2tog, k2, yo* repeat until 1 stitch remains, K1.

Round 5: Knit

Repeat rounds 2-5 five times.

Bind off loosely.

Wet block each mitt allowing the picot sections to create points.

Attach buttons along opposite sides of each mitt. This will allow for a left hand and right hand mitt.

Your 10 small buttons should slip easily between stitches to allow a touch of glamour without the trickiness of button holes.
